## OVERVIEW

# Current Trends within the K-12 Environment



## > Targeted Violence

67% of public schools reported having at least one violent incident, and 59% reported having at least one nonviolent incident.<sup>1</sup>



## > Cybersecurity Threats

Since 2016, there has been a total of 1,331 publicly disclosed school cyber incidents affecting U.S. school districts across a wide array of incidents.<sup>2</sup>



## > Hoax Calls & Swatting

In the 2022-2023 school year, 63.8% of all violent incidents were false reports of an active shooter within the school (i.e., Swatting).<sup>3</sup>



## > Unreported Concerning Behavior

94% of school attackers told a classmate or someone within their school about their plans for violence prior to taking action.<sup>4</sup>

## ENSURING ONLINE SAFETY

THESE ATTACKS CAN IMPACT A SCHOOL'S ABILITY TO CARRY OUT ITS EDUCATIONAL OBLIGATIONS AND PROTECT SENSITIVE STUDENT AND STAFF DATA.



## IMPROVING SCHOOL CLIMATE

DEVELOPING STUDENTS WITH STRONG CHARACTER WHO ARE CONNECTED TO THEIR PEERS, EDUCATORS, AND COMMUNITIES IN MEANINGFUL WAYS CAN IMPROVE SCHOOL CLIMATE, AND BEHAVIORAL AND ACADEMIC OUTCOMES.

IDENTIFY AND ADDRESS THREATENING OR ESCALATING BEHAVIORS BEFORE THEY LEAD TO VIOLENCE.

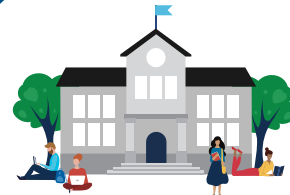


## TRAINING, EXERCISES, & DRILLS

# Targeted Violence

Prevent and mitigate targeted violence incidents.



Targeted violence refers to violence that is premeditated and directed at specific individuals, groups, or locations. Targeted violence is distinct from violence that is impulsive, random, or spontaneous and is often distinguished by pre-attack behaviors that suggest violence as a possible outcome.



During the 2017–18 school year, **80 percent of public schools** recorded that one or more incidents of violence, theft, or other crimes had taken place, amounting to **1.4 million incidents**.

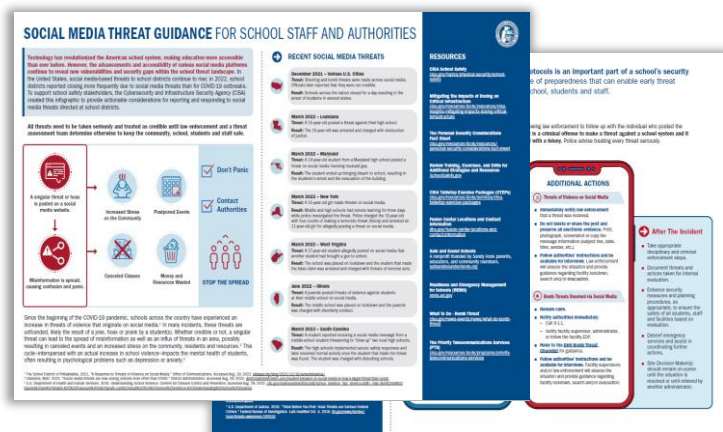


In 2019, students ages 12–18 experienced **764,600 victimizations at school**, translating to a rate of 30 victimizations per 1,000 students at school.

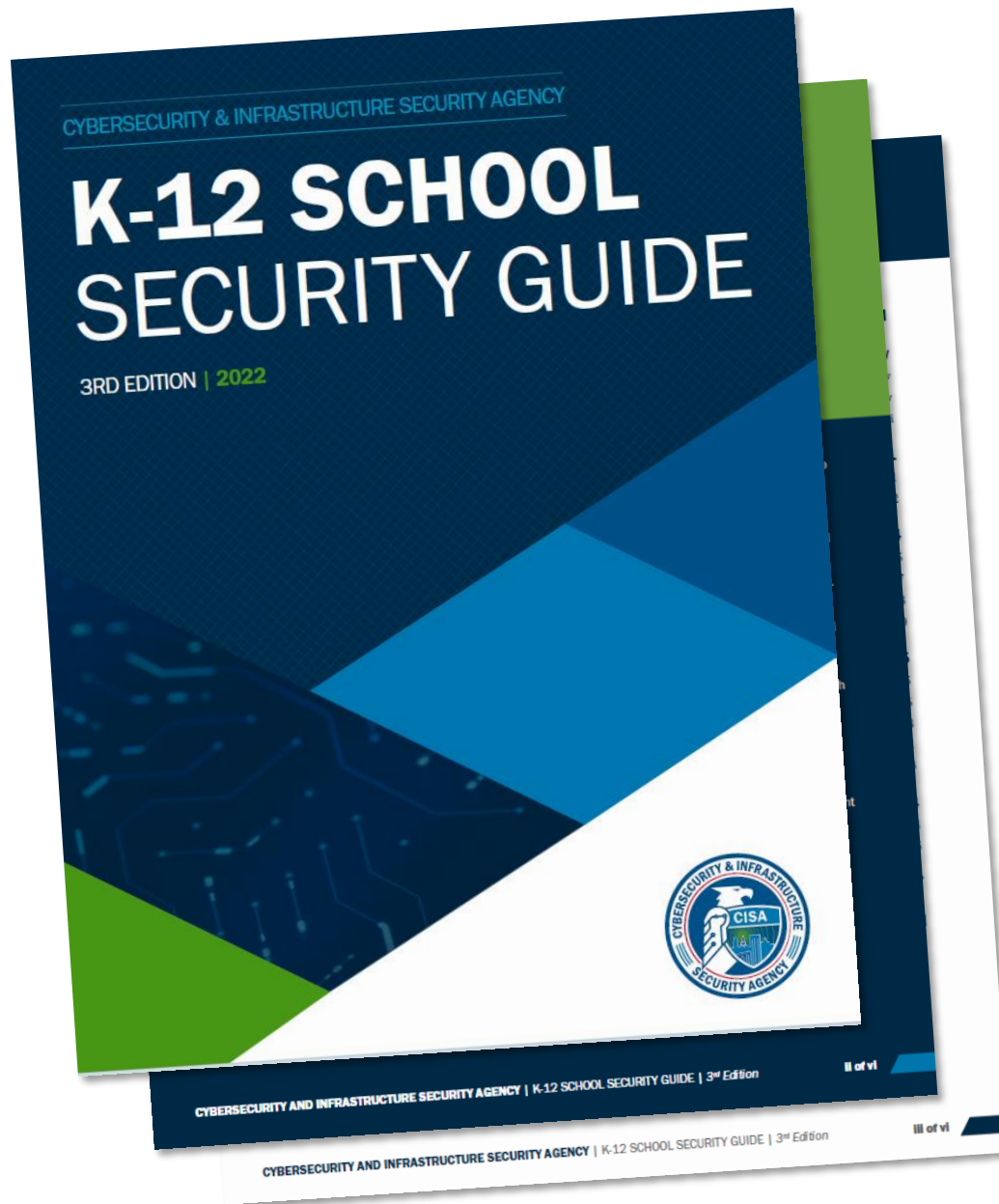

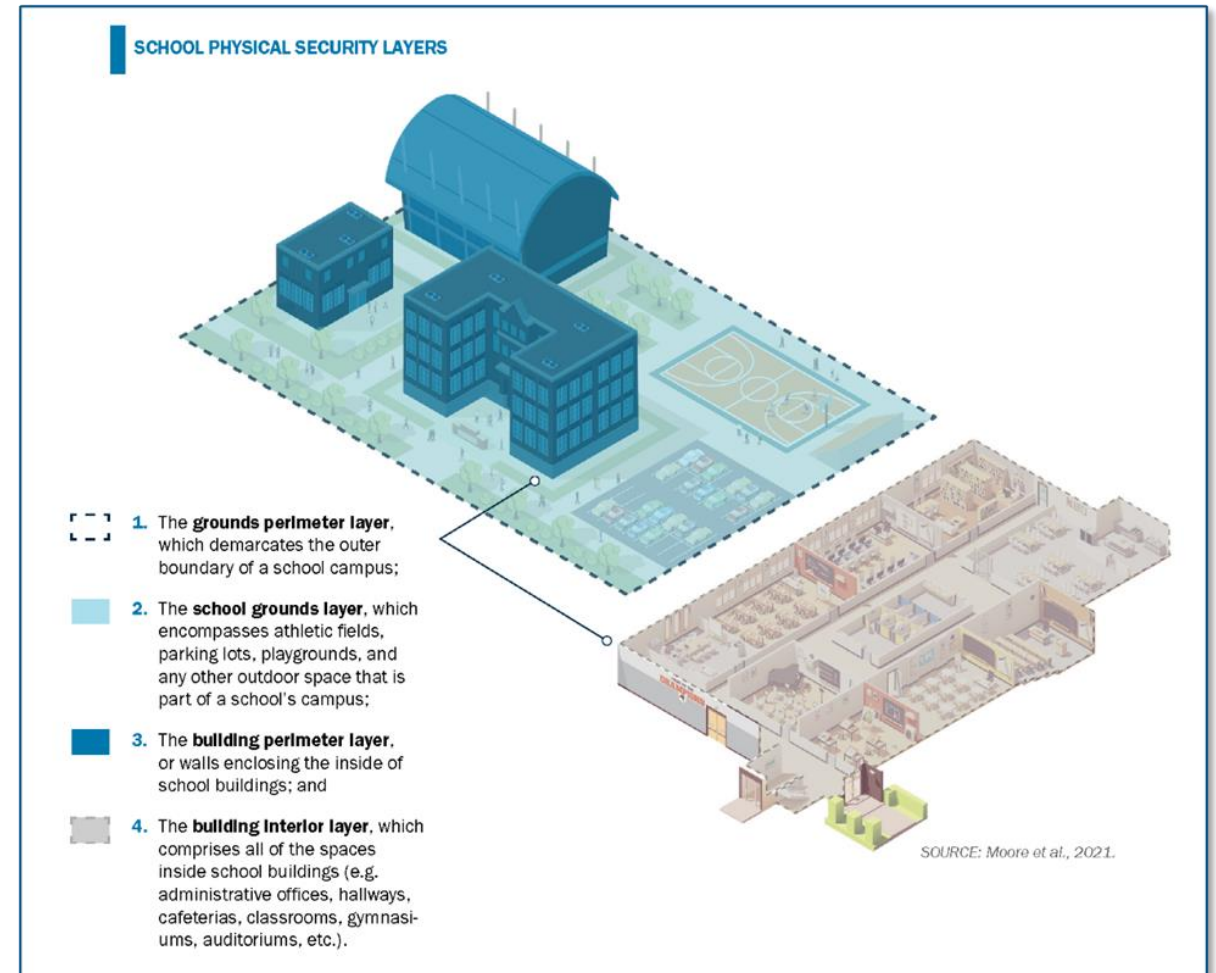

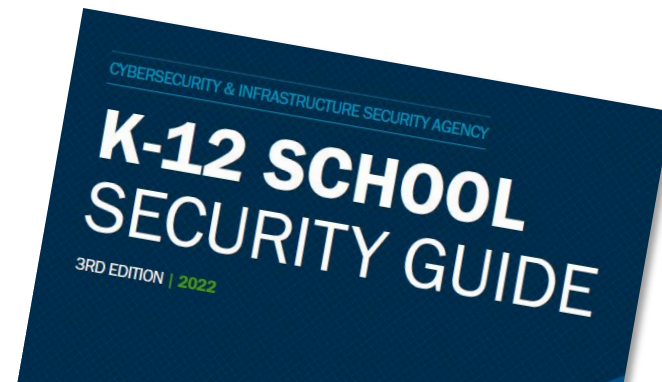

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Identify the location(s) of the threat</li><li>Quickly escape from the threat (via windows, stairs, doors, etc.)</li><li>Leave belongings behind</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Block entry to hiding place and lock doors</li><li>Hide in area out of the shooter's view</li><li>Silence mobile communication devices</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Commit to decisive and aggressive action</li><li>Your goal is to incapacitate the shooter</li><li>Fight until the threat is neutralized</li></ul>
